

Crippled Foot straightened, Stroke Paralytic instantly healed and more...

BRAZZAVILLE, Congo, Aug., 2018 /Christian Newswire/ -- Lead Evangelist Daniel Kolenda and the Christ for All Nations (CfaN) team just concluded four days of historic outreach to the Republic of the Congo, also known as Congo-Brazzaville. God's power to save and to heal was active in every session. Tens of thousands documented decisions to follow Jesus and were ushered into local churches for follow-up and discipleship. Many were miraculously healed, including a young man who broke his ankle

in 2007. From that time his foot had been crippled, bent severely to one side forcing him to walk on its outer ridge in excruciating pain. Then, the Holy Spirit touched him in the crowd. His foot instantly straightened out, the pain left, and he walked so perfectly that no one could have guessed he was crippled just moments before! Another attendee was paralyzed on his left side - the result of a stroke suffered years earlier. During the prayer for the sick God healed him on the spot. He now has full use of his limbs on both sides

of his body! Many, many more shared testimonies of healed lungs, arms, legs, eyes - all glorifying God and validating the truth of His Good News to us through Jesus Christ. These stories are a testament to the enduring commitment of the CfaN team. Problems transporting the four trucks of technical equipment across Africa forced CfaN to postpone the Gospel Outreach Campaign to Congo-Brazzaville by more than a month. CfaN's transport team, led by Winifred Wentland - former German Special For-

ces operative, and long time CfaN technical team leader - spent more than eight weeks driving four tractor-trailer trucks from Nigeria to Congo-Brazzaville. Along the route, they encountered numerous armed checkpoints, bureaucratic delays, washed-out roads, nearly catastrophic wrecks, mudslides and deadly gun violence. Evangelist Kolenda relayed that the team "narrowly escaped death a couple of times. There were shootouts on the road. They crossed active war zones. They showed us today a video of bullets

flying inches from their cars, as armed guards were leading them through war zones. That's what it took to get to this place." Yet, the men who undertook the perilous journey took the perilous journey to say it was 100% worth it. This was CfaN's first Gospel Outreach Campaign in Congo-Brazzaville in 25 years. When you consider that the average age in the nation is a mere 17-years old, you begin to get a sense of how important the work is. It's an entire generation hearing the Gospel and seeing God move in power for the first time. The local pastors, bishops and police reported that these meetings were the largest ever seen in their country - larger even than the most important political rallies. The profile of the event caught the attention of those in the highest places of power. Even the President's wife invited Evangelist Kolenda, together with Rev. Peter Vandenberg (Vice Pres-

ident of CfaN) and John Darku (the African Director for CfaN) to visit the state palace for fellowship and prayer. Evangelist Kolenda relayed, "We've seen salvations, miracles, deliverances, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the power of God invading an entire region. This city has truly been shaken by the power of the Gospel this week. That's what it's all about. That's why we pay the price that we pay. Because Jesus is worthy... He loves these people. He died for them and its worth us taking every risk to reach them." Congo-Brazzaville will undoubtedly never be the same. GFA-supported Workers Use Boats for Rescue and Relief Efforts in Flood-Hit Kerala

WILLS POINT, Texas, Aug., 2018 /Christian Newswire/ -- GFA-supported workers (Gospel for Asia, www.gfa.org) are stepping up efforts to help with rescue and relief efforts in India's flood-stricken Kerala state, as the death toll and number of displaced people in the worst flooding in nearly a century continue to climb. Though rains have mostly subsided, an unknown number of people are still stranded or without food and water, and resources at packed relief camps have been stretched. More than 300 have died as a re-

sult of the flooding, and "thousands remain marooned," according to BBC News. GFA-supported teams have used boats to search for and rescue some of the missing, and visited relief camps to deliver urgently needed supplies, including medicines, food, water and toiletries. Workers at GFA-supported Bridge of Hope centers have also been distributing supplies. GFA founder, Dr. K.P. Yohannan, who visited relief camps to help with the distributions, thanked those who have given money to help the people of Kerala

in desperate need. "You are so far away from us, but actually you are here, through your prayers and your kindness, and together we are doing it," he said in a video report from one of the relief camps. "And Jesus said, 'When you do this, you do it for me, and that's the most important thing. Thank you again for being used by God to care for the poor and wipe their tears.'" Dr. Daniel Johnson, the leader of GFA's-supported medical ministry which has been helping with the relief effort, told how he and the rescue team he

High resolution version available. was part of had to spend the night in the upper floor of a flooded home because they were unable to return to their base in the dark. One man who joined with GFA-supported workers spoke of working for eight hours to save his mother-in-law and some of her neighbors. "We were all in neck-deep or chest-deep flood waters," he said. "It became like Noah's time when floods destroyed all." Eventually, by "God's grace," they were able to get to safety. Even as the immediate crisis ends, the need for help will continue for a long time, Yohannan said. Tens of thousands have been affected by the monsoon, he said, and "it will take years before any of them have any normal life, because they have lost everything." Yohannan appealed for continued prayer and support for those in "desperate need" in the region. "This flooding has devastated crops and completely ruined homes," he said. "It will take the helping hands of many around the world for the people of Kerala to get their feet back on dry ground." Shame on Georgia's Medical Board, reinstating disgraced abortionist license

NORCROSS, Ga., /Christian Newswire/ -- Georgia Right to Life (GRTL) today slammed the Georgia Composite Medical Board for its outrageous and immoral decision to reinstate the medical license for disgraced late-term abortionist Tyrone C. Malloy. "This is a flagrant example of the medical community circling the wagons to protect their own despite patients' safety," said GRTL President Ricardo Davis. "If they're going to put cynicism above ethics they don't deserve to hold this

critical position." Davis called on Governor Deal to immediately demand all 16 board members to resign, or force them out if they refuse. Malloy, who was, and still is director of Old National GYN in College Park, was censured & fined \$10,000 by the board due to a 25-week late term abortion that left a woman dead after suffering heavy bleeding and cardiac arrest. He also spent two years in prison-during which time he surrendered his license-for fraudulently billing Medicaid more than

\$386,000. The board apparently attempted to keep its decision to reinstate Malloy's license last October as quiet as possible. The Atlanta Journal Constitution reported that the board did not follow its usual practice of posting the order on its website. Instead, the only public record was a line in that month's meeting minutes. U.S. News & World Report runs a website-health.usnews.com-which lists profiles of doctors and hospitals. The one for Malloy says he is affiliated with

multiple hospitals in the area, including DeKalb Medical Center and Emory University Hospital. DeKalb Medical Center confirmed to GRTL that Malloy is on their staff, but Emory said it has no record of him being involved in any way with Emory.
